CPME 345, Application for Increase in or Reclassification of Residency Positions

The chart below represents a program that is approved for two residents per year (2/2/2) and is applying for an increase in positions to three residents per year (3/3/3). CPME suggests program directors create a similar chart for their own program to determine if the program meets requirements to support an additional resident.
