Brief History since the Last Comprehensive Evaluation:

April 2021 Council Meeting

Based on review of the comprehensive report of the evaluation team and the college's written response to the team report, the Council granted accreditation of New York College of Podiatric Medicine through April 2026. On-site re-evaluation may be expected during the fall of 2025 or early winter 2026. The maximum first year class enrollment for the institution is 109.

Following review of the on-site team report, the Accreditation Committee and the Council determined that the college is in noncompliance with one standard and requirement from CPME 120, *Standards and Requirements for Accrediting Colleges of Podiatric Medicine*: Standard 1 Requirement D, Ongoing Evaluation Process. The college is required to submit a progress report for consideration at the fall 2021 meetings of the Accreditation Committee and the Council that includes the college's progress in correcting the area of noncompliance.

October 2021 Council Meeting

Following review of the progress report, the Accreditation Committee and the Council determined that the college remains in noncompliance with Standard 1 Requirement D, Ongoing Evaluation Process, from CPME 120, *Standards and Requirements for Accrediting Colleges of Podiatric Medicine*. The college is required to submit a progress report for consideration at the spring 2022 meetings of the Accreditation Committee and the Council that includes the college's progress in correcting the area of noncompliance.

April 2022 Council Meeting

Following review of the progress report, the Accreditation Committee and the Council determined that the college remains in noncompliance with Standard 1 Requirement D, Ongoing Evaluation Process, from CPME 120, *Standards and Requirements for Accrediting Colleges of Podiatric Medicine*. The college is required to submit a progress report for consideration at the fall 2022 meetings of the Accreditation Committee and the Council that includes the college's progress in correcting the area of noncompliance.

October and November 2022 Council Meetings

Following review of the progress report, the Accreditation Committee and the Council determined that the college remains in noncompliance with Standard 1 Requirement D, Ongoing Evaluation Process, from CPME 120, *Standards and Requirements for Accrediting Colleges of Podiatric Medicine*. The college is required to submit a progress report for consideration at the spring 2023 meetings of the Accreditation Committee and the Council that includes the college's progress in correcting the area of noncompliance. The accreditation action from the October 2022 meeting has been rescinded because the college submitted a request for an extension of time to demonstrate compliance with the accreditation standard which, after due consideration, the Council determined there was good cause to grant.

The college must take appropriate action to bring itself into compliance with the noncompliant standard and requirement (1D). Because the Council first identified the NYCPM as being in noncompliance with Standard 1 Requirement D, Ongoing Evaluation Process in April 2021, and an extension for good cause was granted, the college now has until April 2025 to come into compliance with this standard and requirement. Pursuant to the Council's standards and rules, the college is at risk for probation and subsequent withdrawal of accreditation if this area of noncompliance is not corrected.

Concerning the substantive change request, the Accreditation Committee and Council reviewed and granted preliminary approval of the substantive change request at the April 2021 meeting until such time that CPME can conduct an on-site evaluation when the affiliation is operational. The Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) and the New York State Department of Education approved the merger in December 2021. The college reports that it is currently awaiting approval by the New York Attorney General and any other state approvals necessary.
